The Visiting Teaching Associate is a non-tenure track appointment at the University of Illinois. This is a one-year position. A full search will be conducted in the 2018-19 school year. A laboratory mission of innovative curriculum development, outreach to other schools and the community, and/or involvement with professional organizations is part of the overall job responsibilities.

Responsibilities: Teach assigned courses in Physical Education and areas of fitness, sports and strength training. Demonstrate innovative curriculum and instruction. Maintain records of individual student achievement and evaluate students on a daily basis. Support Uni High's shared vision and goals regarding physical education and physical activity. Assist Athletic Director with supervision of athletic events.

Required Qualifications: Bachelor's degree in Physical Education or associated field or substantial background in high school coaching.

Desirable Qualifications: Strong experience in teaching Physical Education. Ability and willingness to coach extracurricular sports. Master's degree.
